Following the event of the August 14 2017 landslide in Freetown, the Freetown Emergency Recovery Project (FERP) was designed to support the government to recover from the impacts of the disaster. The project is implemented under the auspices of the Ministry of Finance, through Project Fiduciary Management Unit (PFMU); with a technical coordinating unit providing support to direct beneficiary institutions including Freetown City Council, Guma Valley water company and Sierra Leone Road Authority (SLRA). The Project Development Objective (PDO) is to rehabilitate selected critical infrastructure and to strengthen government capacity for managing disaster risk. The PDO will be achieved through two components, which align with the findings of the DaLA, and support the Government’s overall recovery program: (i) Rehabilitation of Public Infrastructure and Slope Stabilization; and (ii) Strengthening Institutional Capacity.

The infrastructure component of the project includes construction of Bridges, Culvert and Drainages which requires to undertake Environmental Social Health Impact Assessment to provide technical and scientific information that will inform stakeholders including the Environment Protection Agency to make decision on the project. Hence, three sets of EIAs has been prepared under this project.
