Assignment Title: Relaunch of Consulting Services for The Site Feasibility Study, Preliminary Design and Preparation of Bidding Documents for The Detailed Design and Development of a Sanitary Landfill in Western Area

The Government of Sierra Leone has received funding from International Development Association IDA of the World Bank towards the cost of Resilient Urban Sierra Leone Project and intends to apply part of the proceeds of the funding for consulting services for the Site Feasibility Study, Preliminary Design and Preparation of Bidding Documents for the Detailed Design and Build of a sanitary landfill in Western Area.

The specific tasks to be undertaken by the Consultant are as follows:

- Review of available information and collect specific site data, such as maps, reports, geological or hydrogeological data;
- Review, validate and update current and future waste generation quantities, and transportation and disposal infrastructure, based on recent studies and investigation, as per Annex 2.
- Evaluate design conditions and report the engineering analysis, complete with identification of design issues and needs; in terms of technical, time, cost, quality and sustainability;
- Prepare preliminary design of projected facility for an **operational capacity of, at least 15 years** within an engineered structure and adoption of, modern and effective method of disposal in terms of environment, cost, applicability and sustainability;
- Select best international practices and technologies to prevent environmental impacts associated with the new facility and conduct stakeholder consultations to validate these technical options are appropriate and feasible in the country context;

- Provide Social and Environmental consultants with baseline data, design and operational information to inform ESIA and RAP;
- Prepare technical specifications, sketches and bill of quantities with estimated costs of the new facility and all site auxiliary infrastructure
- Produce the tender documentation for a design-build (D/B) contract according to the World Bank requirements; the task/prelim design will need to be conducted in compliance with applicable laws and regulations (ex: zoning and land use restrictions, zoning buffers, waste management, ENV protection law, health, etc.)

The detailed Terms of Reference (TOR) for the assignment will only be provided to shortlisted firms.

The **Project Fiduciary Management Unit (PFMU)** now invites eligible consulting firms to indicate their interest in providing the Services.

Interested Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services.

The shortlisting criteria are:

- required qualifications and experience of the firm
- core business and years in business, relevant experience,
- technical and managerial capability of the firm.

Key Experts will not be evaluated at the shortlisting stage.

Eligibility

The Consultancy service is open to Civil Engineering firms holding at least 10 years' experience in waste management and having designed and supervised works/operations of at least 2 engineered sanitary landfills of minimum size 50 acres, whereby the design included geomembrane liners, leachate networks and landfill gas abstraction and flaring.

Interested Consultancy firms shall submit the following:

- i. Covering Letter;
- ii. A profile of the Company, its organization and staffing (joint venture between international and local consultants must outline the Joint venture/ partnership arrangements);
- iii. In the case of associations between two or more firms, the name, address and profile of the participating firms, and the nature of the association such as joint venture or consortium or subcontracting or memorandum of understanding, with identification of the lead firm;
- iv. Details of experience on similar assignments undertaken in the last 10 years, including size/nature, and Clients' details and locations

The attention of interested consultants is drawn to Section III, paragraphs, 3.14, 3.16, and 3.17 of the World Bank's "Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers" July 2016 Revised November 2017 and August 2018 ("Procurement Regulations"), setting forth the World Bank's policy on conflict of interest.

Firms may associate with other firms to enhance their qualifications, but should indicate clearly whether the association is in the form of a joint venture and/or a sub-consultancy. In the case of a joint venture, all the partners in the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable for the entire contract, if selected.

A Firm will be selected in accordance with the Selection Methods for Quality Cost Based Selection set out in the Procurement Regulations.
